
Studio leftovers: Belonging with & for [hot-desking] studio D305




Our project aims to:


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























What can left overs do?

Method as Intervention

* I believe how I've internalized that system and how you have internalized the system can be changed, but you need a lot of help to do that. It's not something I could have got to on my own, it's a product of community and history and luck and conversations like this. Data Analysis:

I don't think its about availability, cause it is about a sense of belonging

Agency

*I am the happiest as a room when people feel okay about messing me up...and moving the tables and chairs, <u>and just</u> making me work for them, rather than hoping that I am there for them without trying.

*My favourite thing is when students or staff <u>take ownership of</u> <u>me</u> and change my configuration

* think the space is great to manipulate.

I don't think the power of affecting the room you are in is actually known a lot of the time.. cause I asked uhmmm, but I feel like, a lot of people might feel like that they don't have any control over their environment, but they do

Students that use me don't feel like they have permission to alter the space..

Access as support

*I am so glad to support them, [...] I want to be with them a little bit more, especially in this moment of the living crisis where they can't afford heating or whatever...

- * I wish there could be other little things maybe, that could be part of my contribution to students, like toos...
- * I am section of a space and the rest of the d30s are collaborators of this space
- *digital entity instead of being completely traditional as a studio space
- *I think they should put a clear timetable with the opening times and the classes and when we are allowed to be here so we can always

Display

*I'm not a lost cause..<u>you can put your work up in me,</u> you can speak about me lovingly and things will get better

*I enjoy seeing students work.

*quite nice <u>if I was covered by their work</u>, on the walls. I enjoy seeing students work.

*And that is another way that they can be covering me up, with their expression and their exploration, or their creativity, their imagination, their work, even if its throwaways, its a sort of proud moment, as a room, to, umm be a contributor to that sort of creativity *So many people use my space and they dont leave anything for me

*Maybe if there was areas.... where something stayed, could be displayed

* people could have continual presence...

*if there's examples of stuff made from different studios

Data Analysis *How did you feel talking as the room?

I think we do fight for each other and we do fight to make it work...
I maybe go back maybe we do belong to each other..
maybe we do..

Other things that happened:

- * Eleni started putting studio leftovers on the wall, at the end / as part of every session.
- *Tutors that had been interviewed also started putting student work on the walls
- *A student found a leftover of theirs on the wall and said they felt honored that someone had featured their work and it was complemented by others.
- * A group of Y2 students asked if they are allowed to put their work on the wall

Next steps:

- * Eleni is developing a system where hotdesking studios like me are full rather than bare
- -What if every student put a drawing on the wall at the end of every session?

At the end of each exhibition at Eastside Projects we build on, recycle and upcycle its remains. In this way, each exhibition alters the space, and the space writes and records its own history. Each new addition responds to and alters the existing conditions. The gallery accumulates the traces of its use as part of a learning process. Eastside Projects Manual, (2005)
